Mary Catherine Bateson will share her thoughts and research on the impact of improved health and longevity on marriage, childbearing, education, work, and retirement. Most recently, she has focused on a phase she terms “Adulthood II,” the period of relatively robust health that precedes the onset of frail old age.

Dr. Bateson is a cultural anthropologist, linguist, Middle East specialist, and author who approaches her work from a multi-disciplinary perspective. Daughter of noted anthropologists Margaret Mead and Gregory Bateson, she has written and co-authored many books and articles, lectured across the country and abroad, and is currently a visiting scholar at the Center on Aging & Work/Workplace Flexibility at Boston College.
